All work must be released for individual usage or purpose usage grants. All entries must contain copyright-free art or art released for entrants and public use.

Submissions and displays may be anonymous if you choose.

Your email address will be known only to Emily Tamas and will only be used to contact you specific to this event.

- All art must be small enough to be moved by no more than 2 people and generally fit through a standard commercial door.
- Chosen submissions should be paired with a stand, easel, etc. are required for display. The event team will provide some tables but will likely not be able to hang items from the walls of the event space.
- Images that depict actual violence that could be emotionally harmful to attendees may be passed over for this event or placed behind a screen or curtain with a content warning.
- Entries should represent the theme of the day which is awareness and prevention of sexual assault. Works may include themes of survival, resilience, the impact of sexual violence, etc.
- Any original art medium submitted by the artist is eligible. This includes painting, drawing, multimedia, sculpture, photography, etc
- The committee will meet in February to choose art for the event, and you will be notified by email if chosen by March 1st.

#### \*AWARD DETAILS FROM PAGE 4:

Innovative Program Award: for programs creatively addressing awareness, education, and/or prevention specific to sexual violence. (RCCs may nominate themselves for innovative programming beyond the contractual and regulatory requirements

SAAMy Award: for individuals who've made exceptional contributions to the anti-rape movement at either the local, regional, or statewide level

Fonetta A. Elam Award: recognition of exemplary clinical supervision for those working to address sexual violence

The Eileen A Recktenwald Collaborative Spirit Award: recognition for excellence in developing collaboration/partnerships that significantly benefit survivors and/or those working to help survivors.

It is okay if you don't know which award might be best for your nominee, the committee will consider all appropriate options.
