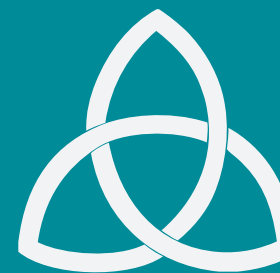

Sexual Assault Response Team (SART)

SARTs use a multidisciplinary approach to investigate and treat victims of sexual violence and may consist of law enforcement, advocates, prosecutors, crime labs, and a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner.

SARTs utilize a victim centered approach, providing the victim with compassionate, efficient and skilled care and support throughout the criminal justice process.

SART members receive advanced training and protocol guidelines which improves the quality of evidence and strengthens the evidence admissibility in court. Reporting and conviction rates have increased in states where SART models are in place.

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE)

A sexual assault nurse examiner (SANE) is a registered nurse who obtained specialized training in the forensic examination of sexual assault victims and is credentialed by the Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN).

A SANE conducts the forensic examination, collects and preserves physical evidence, and testifies in legal proceedings.

KENTUCKY CREDENTIAL

Kentucky is one of few states that has legislated a SANE credential. The credential is issued by the KBN upon completion of the SANE training, including both the classroom portion and clinical requirements, and upon receiving the established application fee from the nurse. To maintain the SANE credential, the SANE must complete 5 hours of continuing education related to the area of sexual assault each annual licensure period, November 1- October 31. The 5 hours may be included in the 14 contact hours required to maintain the registered nurse license. The registered nurse license and SANE credential are renewed concurrently.
