ACCESS HEALING PROJECT

As service providers, we are committed to meeting people where they are and working to ensure that our services are inclusive and responsive to the real needs of survivors. Our data shows that we are failing to reach all survivors equally, especially those in the LGBTQIA and BIPOC communities, as well as Kentuckians using substances.

With new grant funding, we have formed an Advisory Council made up of ~35 Kentuckians in those communities who have been affected by sexual violence. Members of the project share their ideas and experiences to guide KASAP, its Board of Directors, and member centers to become more welcoming to and representative of all people in Kentucky.

There are three main projects that are prioritized with Access Healing; the advisory council, the podcast, and training and education.



KASAP IS HIRING!

Position: Training Coordinator Location: Hybrid (remote and in-office) Anticipated start date: November 1



We at KASAP are expanding our team again and are looking to add a training coordinator position this fall!

The KASAP Training Coordinator will work collaboratively with KASAP staff and member programs to assess training needs, develop appropriate curricula from new and existing resources, and facilitate training throughout the state.

This position will work to consolidate KASAP training efforts and provide consistent training across coalition member programs and partners.

Additional responsibilities will be the organization, distribution and monitoring of a regular training calendar and assisting other staff, as needed, in coordinating, facilitating, and providing remote and in person training in Kentucky.

As part of a statewide coalition, the Training Coordinator may be based remotely anywhere in Kentucky, with the understanding that at least one day a week will need to be present in the Frankfort office and that meetings may take place in other parts of the state. This is a full-time, salaried position (40 hours/week), requiring and offering flexible hours.
